

A Party Apartment on Suzhou Creek

苏州河畔的派对公寓

A bachelor from Tuscany settled in Shanghai and employed architects Nunzia Carbone and Svetlana Petric to design the quintessential bachelor pad in the famous "Embankment Building" on Suzhou creek. The theme of the apartment's interior is contrast. Plain building materials and minimalist furnishings are thrown into relief with traditional lamps and splendid golden wallpaper.

The Soaring is made of recycled wooden gates over 100 years old and maintains its original look without any lacquering or surface treatment. The loft ceiling with its exposed beams has been painted white to emphasize the building's structural elements. This paint highlights the building's geometric patterns and makes a pleasant distinction from the rest of the aubergine colored ceiling.

In order to contrast the stark unfinished feel of the apartment, the designers created a luxurious lighting scheme, which includes a spherical lamp with an inverted Chinese character, "福," meaning "fortune." A red chandelier in the bathroom casts a muted glow over the concrete walls. Suspended over the dining table, a soaring glass eagle light fixture spreads its wings across the room. The dining room's main feature is a mysterious black wall, the surface of which reflects activities within the room as well as the scenery outside. This wall's intricate design can leave a visitor baffled; some of the panes are drawers, others are doors leading to bathrooms, bedrooms and wardrobes and a few panels lead to nothing at all. Decorative doorknobs are the only indicator of a potential entrance in this delightful trick the designer plays on the tenant.

An enormous bathtub by the bedroom window is a unique, multi-purpose piece of furniture. Technical reasons prevented the tub from being placed in the bathroom. However, this location has its advantages; the beautiful scenery outside the window adds a relaxing element to any bath. Unlike most tubs, this one acts as a perfect container for champagne during or after a party!

一位来自美丽的意大利托斯卡纳的单身贵族落户上海，在苏州河畔著名的“河滨大楼”购买了公寓。他邀请设计师Nunzia Carbone 和Svetlana Petric将房子打造成一派粗狂的单身公寓，室内设计主题就是对比：朴素的建筑材料和繁杂的家具摆设对应着传统复杂的灯饰和金碧辉煌的壁纸，却相安无事。

铺屋顶板用的材料取自拥有100多年历史的木门，地板保留着木材的本色，没有上漆也没有经过任何处理。为了与之相配，天花板也没有上漆。裸露的横梁被刷成白色，以突出其在房屋中的几何形效果。正好与茄子紫色的天花板相映成趣。

为了与繁复的传统装饰风格对比，设计师在室内灯光方面选择了奢华。门口意味着幸福的倒“福”字旁有盏吊灯，深室内大红色的吊灯散发着柔和的光芒，餐桌上方像展翅高飞的鹰形玻璃灯饰形象非常夸张。餐厅墙有趣的设置过于那堵黑色的石墙；到了晚上，打开灯，墙面便会映出房内和窗外的景色。这堵墙是整座公寓设计最精妙之处，既让来客感到迷惑，又感觉新奇；墙上有些板块是抽屉，有些板块是门，可以分别通向洗手间、卧室、客厅、餐厅。你问来客这是什么都没有，没有标识，只有一个个装饰性的门把手告诉你可能的入口。这是设计师别出心裁的一个有趣的恶作剧。

你要来参加派对的莫过于窗边那个大浴缸了。将浴缸安置于此，一是出于技术上的原因不能安置在洗手间，二来是因为这里环境很好，房主人在这里待了一天后，一边享受着浴缸水，一边欣赏窗外美丽的景色，该是多么惬意啊！浴缸还有一个用途令我们大开眼界：开party的时候，可以在里面装满香槟供大家享用！

Minimalism on the Creek

苏州河畔的简约主义

Juan, a native of Malaysia, rented a 1920s apartment in the Embankment Building on the north shore of Suzhou Creek. This portion of town has been poorly preserved through the years and as a result, many of the original Art Deco designs have faded away. Despite some unfortunate dilapidation, the Suzhou Creek area has an appealing tranquility and serenity that sets it apart from many other areas of Shanghai. Slightly removed from the city's centre, the neighbourhood observes the bustling downtown traffic, without being overwhelmed by it. The full aural experience is completed by the sounds of babbling brooks and singing crickets.

Juan's apartment occupies a curved corner of the Embankment Building. This curvature gives way to a spacious living room that looks out on the creek and provides a striking view of the majestic Jin Mao and Oriental Pearl Towers in Pudong.

Juan's interior decoration and advertising sensibilities have manifested in a minimalist style. Rather than adopt a traditional Chinese or Asian décor, Juan chose simple and functional, neoclassical European furniture for the entire apartment. The two Italian architects who designed the apartment, Nuria Calzane and Svetlana Petric, constructed a long narrow corridor just behind the entrance that leads to the other rooms. Two wooden lattice doors complement the otherwise stark environment and harmonize the interior.

Juan's emphasis on minimalism for interior design stems from a desire to draw a contrast between the environment that surrounds him and his personal space.

来自马来西亚的Juan的公寓位于苏州河沿岸的大楼——建造于上世纪40年代的历史性保护建筑。由于多年来没有得到妥善的保护，墙面和地面已不复当年Art Deco的那般光彩和气派了。虽然外观有些破旧，但位于苏州河畔的Juan的公寓却有不同于上海其他地区的安宁和宁静，这是离开市中心不远，能随处可见到的本色之美。耳朵听到的是流水与蝉鸣之声，Juan的公寓位于大楼的蓝色玻璃旁，宽敞的客厅正对着苏州河，安静纯真的开端，这便是去，可以看到气势雄伟的金茂大厦和浦东世界的东方明珠。

Juan本人从事广告业，对室内设计有着敏锐的触觉。这从公寓的简洁主义设计风格可见一斑。Juan将自己满意的中式风格全部丢弃或掩盖起来，选择传统的欧洲风格。意大利设计师Nuria Calzane和Svetlana Petric正在进门处设计了一条长长的走廊通向公寓其他房间。墙上红色的两扇木格子镂空门丰富了原本略显僵硬的视觉环境，令整个空间显得十分和谐。Juan偏爱现代主义的室内设计，因为他希望在周围平淡色彩的丛林里做一个对比。








